DPCDSB is one of the largest and most diverse school boards in Ontario, serving approximately 72,000 students and employing approximately 10,500 staff in Mississauga, Brampton, Caledon, and Dufferin County. DPCDSB has grown from 23 founding Catholic schools to 151 schools (125 elementary and 26 secondary) over the past fifty years. Alongside the pastoral leadership of the Archdiocese of Toronto, we work closely and in partnership with 46 Catholic churches and missions. Our DPCDSB communities are supported with an enriching Catholic education that nurtures student achievement and faith development. We are committed to ensuring safe, caring, inclusive Catholic school communities, in which every student can learn, grow, and succeed.

Ministry of Education Curriculum Updates – The Ministry continues to work through a renewal of curriculum documents with a focus on overhauling the requirements for completion of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). This is the first overhaul to secondary diploma requirements since 1999 and has been designed by the Ministry to ensure students are equipped to handle the demands for jobs needed in today's global economy.

- **Financial Literacy Graduation Requirement** – has been added to the graduation requirements of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Students entering Grade 9 in September 2024 are required to pass a financial literacy test with a score of 70% as part of their graduation requirements. A student's first attempt is taken during the Grade 10 mathematics course. If unsuccessful, a student will have the opportunity to rewrite the test. If still unsuccessful, credit recovery and other supports will be put into place to obtain completion of this requirement. This test is based on cumulative financial literacy learned from Grade 1 through 9.
- **Mathematics** – An additional change to mathematic course requirements takes effect for the Grade 9 course. All students entering Grade 9 in September 2024 will now have 10% of their final grade in their course derived from their EQAO assessment.
- **Technological Credit** – Changes have been made to the compulsory credit requirements for the OSSD. Students beginning secondary school in September 2024 must obtain one (1) credit in technological education in Grade 9 or 10.
- **STEM** – For the required compulsory credits, the three Group 1, 2, and 3 compulsory credits have been replaced with one science, technology, engineering, mathematics (STEM) related course group credit. The STEM related course group includes business studies, computer studies, cooperative education, mathematics (in addition to the three (3) required compulsory credits in this subject), science (in addition to the two (2) compulsory credits in this subject) and technological education (in addition to the one (1) compulsory credit in this subject).
- **Credits** – The number of required compulsory credits has been reduced to 17 (from the previous total of 18). Secondary students continue to be required to earn 30 credits to graduate.
- **OYAP** – The Ministry has also announced a new stream to extend the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP), which will allow students in Grade 11 and 12 to participate in more apprenticeship learning through additional co-operative education credits. This stream will be recognized by a specific seal on the student's diploma. More details are expected to be forthcoming from the Ministry.
- **Mental Health** – Two (2) new learning modules focused on student mental health and well-being have been added to GLC20 - the Grade 10 Career Studies course.

Catholic School Councils (CSC) – Communication between home, school and parish is enhanced with active parent involvement in our schools and CSC. Council meetings are an opportunity to share important information and updates while engaging families in the local school decision-making process. It is the policy of DPCDSB that each school has a CSC, which is advisory in nature, and governed by the Ontario Education Act. CSCs are empowered to make recommendations, in accordance with Regulation 612/00 of the Education Act, to the school principal and the school board and serve to:

- Promote the mission, vision, and values of the board;
- Support the sacramental life and Catholic practices of the board;
- Promote and support co-operation and communication with the local parish and the Ontario Association of Parents in Catholic Education (OAPCE);
- Be faithful to its' mission;
- Improve student well-being and achievement and;
- Enhance the accountability of the education system to parents.

Parents/guardians are encouraged to attend your school's CSC meetings and to consider putting your name forward to become a voting member on your council. All schools are advised to post their updated meeting minutes and agenda items on their school websites to ensure all members of the school community can stay informed.

Direction of School Support – Show your support for the Catholic education system by ensuring you are registered as an English Separate (Catholic) School Supporter on your property tax designation.

By directing your tax support to the Separate (Catholic) School System:

- You may vote for Catholic School Trustees in Municipal elections
- Your children may attend Catholic elementary schools
- You show your support for the Catholic school system

To verify your school support designation, please check the assessment section of your Tax Bill or Property Assessment Notice.

Have you moved? – Even if you have been an English Separate (Catholic) School Supporter in the past, the designation does NOT follow you when you relocate. By default, your property taxes support the municipality's English public school board. Every time you move or if there is a change of ownership, it is essential that you register yourself as an English Separate (Catholic) school supporter. Therefore, as we start the year, staffing is still tentative and until actual numbers are realized and assessed, reorganization of classes is a strong possibility. If we need to reorganize the school, it will take place on Monday, September 16, 2024, our PA Day. You will be notified ahead of time if changes need to be made.

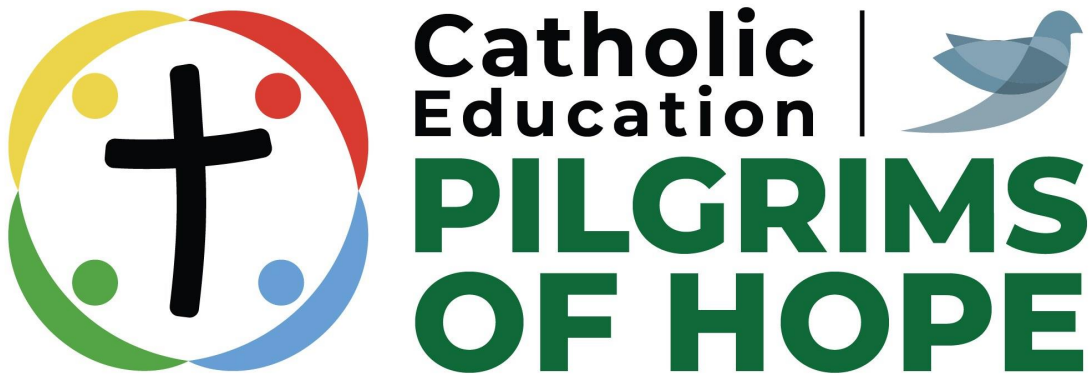

September Medical Reminder:

Anaphylaxis



As we begin a new school year, we would like to inform you that All Saints Elementary, is an allergen aware school. There are pupils in attendance who suffer from severe and life-threatening allergies to certain foods, such as peanut and nut products. Exposure to the smallest quantities can cause severe life-threatening reactions.

Anaphylaxis is a severe and life-threatening allergic reaction. The most common allergens triggers are food, insect stings, medications, exercise and latex. An anaphylactic reaction involves symptoms from two or more body systems. The safety and well-being of all of our students is a priority.

In order to ensure the safety and well being of all pupils, we request that you NOT send any lunches or snacks that contain peanuts and or tree nuts, including peanut butter substitute products (if possible). Please make sure that all of your children's caregivers are aware of the food restrictions. Please avoid sending food for birthday or special occasions. There are many alternatives such as stickers and pencils. Should there be a specific allergy concern in your child's classroom, information will be shared by the classroom teacher.

We appreciate your cooperation in supporting a safe learning environment for all pupils.

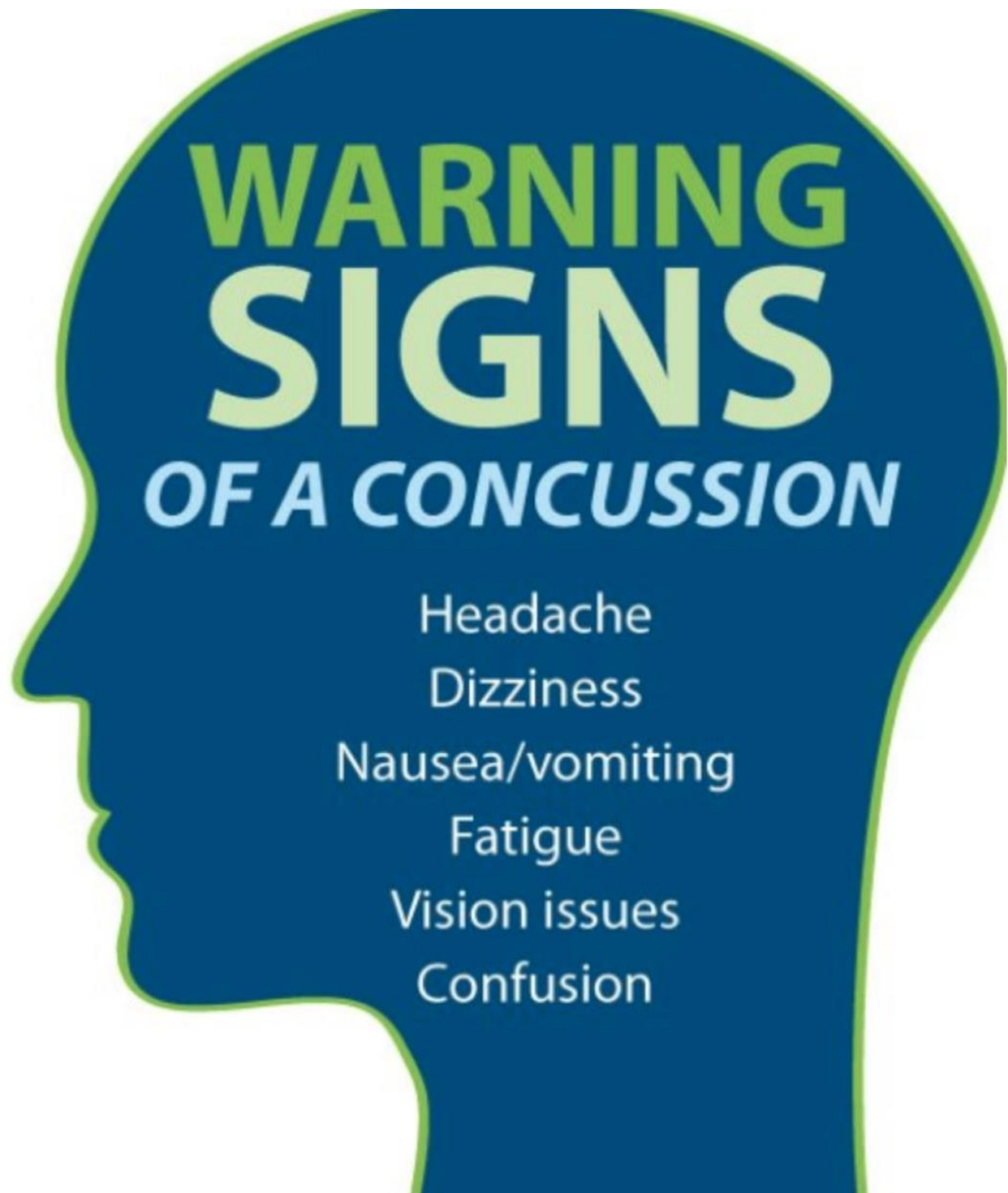
Asthma Awareness



We would also like to remind families that All Saints school continues to participate in "We Share the Air", a scent sensitivity awareness campaign. There are students in attendance who suffer from life-threatening asthmatic conditions to air pollutants. Exposure to even minimal odours may cause a potential life-threatening reaction.

Very common triggers are: perfume, cologne, scented products, personal care, such as hairspray. The safety of our students is priority. In order to ensure the safety and well-being of all students, we request that our school community refrain from wearing scented personal products, complying with our Scent Free Zone Campaign at school and all school events. We appreciate your cooperation in supporting a safe learning environment for all students.

Concussions and Head Injuries



Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board has developed a Concussion Policy and Guidelines for students who have been diagnosed with a concussion by either a medical doctor or nurse practitioner. School staff cannot diagnose a concussion. Anytime a student reports to the office with a head injury, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the incident will be entered into the school's "Documentation

of Head Injuries” log. This is precautionary only, and we ask that you check your child when he/she gets home for any signs of a concussion or illness. We will also encourage you to go onto our school website, where a brochure containing information about Concussions is provided. Again this is a precautionary measure and for information purposes.

Attendance Verification

What is SafeArrival:

- SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety.
- It supports school staff to follow up on unexcused absences.
- It allows parents and/or guardians to notify the school in advance about an upcoming absence.

Child Safety



The Child and Family Services Act compels educators to report any issues that may compromise a child's welfare. If a staff member suspects any issue that may affect a child's safety, then Children's Aid Society (CAS) must be contacted. It is our Legal Obligation as employees of the school to report any suspicions directly to the Children's Aid Society. It is not the role of educators to investigate. That is CAS' role.
