Kiss 'n Ride and Fire Route Lane

Parents are reminded that there should not be cars parked in the Fire Route/Kiss 'n Ride Lanes in the morning or after school, including for PLASP drop offs and pick ups. Wet, Windy, Wintery Weather is upon us! Students are asked to have a pair of indoor shoes that can be kept at school, along with an extra pair of gloves, mitts, or other winter apparel. Programmes

Registration for St. James Catholic Global Learning Centre International Baccalaureate Programmes for the 2025-2026 school year (Kindergarten to Grade 8) will take place from Monday, January 13 to Thursday, January 16, 2025.

St. James Catholic Global Learning Centre is an authorized International Baccalaureate (I.B.) World School which offers the Primary Years Programme (PYP) and Middle Years Programme (MYP). The programmes provide learning opportunities with a global focus for students from Kindergarten to Grade 8. International Baccalaureate programmes aim to develop resilient, self-motivated young people who have the knowledge, skills, and sense of purpose they need to thrive throughout their lives and contribute to making the world a better place.

St. James C.G.L.C. is a regional elementary school open to all DPCDSB Catholic students and is located in southeast Mississauga. Please note that **student transportation is not provided** for this regional school.

As a regional site, St. James C.G.L.C. does not offer online registration through the board's online system. The registration process is outlined on the <u>registration section of the school website</u>. The completed registration form(s) and supporting documentation can be sent by email to <u>St.JamesInfo@dpcdsb.org</u>. In the event the number of applications exceeds the number of allotted spaces, completed applications received by the due date will be subject to the random selection process. To be included in the random selection process, registrations must be received by 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 16, 2025.

Admissions are open to Catholic children and children of Catholic parents. Kindergarten students must be at least four (4) years of age by December 31, 2025. If applying to the DPCDSB for the first time, it is recommended that the child first be registered at their home school.



Language

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) continues to be dedicated to establishing a culture of respect and belonging that fosters safe and inclusive learning environments which are in compliance with the Ontario Human Rights Code. We sincerely believe that this needs to be done in collaboration with family and community members. Recognition of the human dignity of each person, created in the image of God, forms the foundation of equity and inclusive education. As a fait community we have the a duty to

examine all language and we must always be attentive and responsive to times when harmful or offensive words enter our learning spaces. The DPCDSB expectation is that the n-word or any of its derivatives is never to be said or written within learning spaces and any instances of its use will be appropriately and immediately addressed in order to prioritize student, staff and community safety.

The collective goal is to create spaces that are safe and free of words that are rooted in racism and hatred. The DPCDSB believes that those who are directly impacted by the use of this work are the voices that must be centered. Staff will consider a variety of contextual information when responding to instances of the usage of this word.

Students of all ages are being exposed to this word in a variety of contexts and as such we would ask that you enter into age appropriate conversations with your children surrounding the expectation that the n-word is not to be said or written within learning spaces.

In our efforts to maintain safe and inclusive educational learning spaces we are sharing this information with parents/caregivers to encourage continued dialogue surrounding this expectation. Together, we can continue our collective work in strengthening a community that models kindness, values compassion, and fosters educational spaces rooted in our Catholic Social Teachings.



Winter is fast approaching and it's important that everyone riding a school bus is familiar with STOPR's inclement weather and cancellation procedures.

As part of these procedures, the Region of Peel has been divided into three weather zones as weather conditions may require cancellation in a specific zone or zones. STOPR will monitor weather and road conditions and when it is necessary to cancel transportation due to inclement weather, STOPR will cancel by "weather zone." (i.e., Zone 1, Zone 2 and/or Zone 3).



How do I find out what weather zone my school is in?

It is important that all families know what weather zone their school is assigned to. You can find a weather zone map and weather zone descriptions on this page.

A complete list of schools and assigned weather zones can be found on our Weather Cancellations page.

Parents can also log into our Parent/Student Portal to access their childrens' busing and weather zone information.

How are Weather Cancellations Communicated?

School bus cancellations will be communicated by the appropriate weather zone number prior to 06:00am each morning through the

- STOPR X account @STOPRInfo 1
- On the STOPR Delayed Buses webpage
- 3. On school board websites dpcdsb.org and peelschools.org

What if I live in a different weather zone than my school? Most families live within their school's weather zone.

For families who happen to live outside of their school's weather zone, they should review the STOPR weather zone map and confirm what zone their home address is located within.

On inclement weather mornings, these families will need to monitor the STOPR website for both their "school weather zone" and "home weather zone" for cancellations.

For families who live outside their "school weather zone," their transportation will be cancelled if either their "school weather zone" cancels or their "home weather zone cancels."

School bus winter safety tips to help keep your children safe:

- Make sure children are dressed appropriately for cold weather as unexpected mechanical problems with a school bus can occur.
- Know your bus pickup time in the morning and always arrive at your bus stop at least 5 minutes early. Allow extra time to get to your school bus stop during the winter months.
- Parents/Guardians are responsible for the safe conveyance of their children to and from the bus stop location.
- Kindergarten and grade one students must always be accompanied to/from their bus stop location.
- Kindergarten and grade one students must always be met at the bus stop at the end of the day by a parent/guardian or caregiver.

What should you do if your bus is late or cancelled?

It is important to talk to your children about what to do if their school bus is delayed or cancelled on inclement weather mornings.

Do your children have a plan if their bus does not arrive?

Do your children have an emergency contact person?

(i.e., neighbour, friend, relative etc.) who they can call or go to if their bus is delayed or does not arrive to pick them up in the morning.

Bus Route Numbers:

All STOPR bus routes have an assigned route number. This number will be displayed in the side window of your bus.

It is important that you know your child's bus route number, not only to ensure your child is boarding the correct bus each morning, but you will also need the route number when you check for delay or cancellation info on our website.

A friendly reminder to the families of students who are requiring the service of a wheelchair bus, your driveway must be kept cleared of snow and ice to avoid a disruption in the service.

STOPR encourages all parents to set up an account on <u>stopr.ca</u> to access their children's bus information and receive automatic delay and cancellation alerts.
